

Captain John H. Iarrobino Scholarship Application

Sponsored by the USS Oriskany Reunion Association

This scholarship was established in memory of Captain John H. Iarrobino, the commanding officer of the USS Oriskany from 1966-1967.

To be eligible for this scholarship the applicant must be a resident of the Oriskany Central School District or a descendent of a USS Oriskany crew member. The recipient of the scholarship can receive up to \$500 toward the cost of their continuing education. Two scholarships will be awarded: one for Oriskany students and one for descendants. Your application will be reviewed by members of the USS Oriskany Reunion Association, a group for veterans who served aboard the aircraft carrier (1950-1976).

This scholarship is available for a student to continue their education. It does not matter if it is a college, university, community college, or technical school. These scholarships are for any student that is going on to continue their education at any school that allows a student to help them meet their goals in life. The student will have to prove that they have completed one semester of continuing education and have registered for the second semester or term, at which time the monies will be sent to that school. Just because a shipmate student did not receive a scholarship the first time out, does not mean they should not apply the next year.
